Aphysician diagnoses a patient with a qualifying condition for low-THC cannabis or medical marijuana. If the patient is younger than Borteminal, a second physician mist concur and this determination must be reflected in the patient's medical records.

The physician obtains voluntary, written, informed consent from the patient.

The physician enters the order into the Medical Marijuana Use Registry.

The patient must apply for a Medical Marijuana Use Registry Identification card.

The patient may fill the order at any approved Medical Marijuana Treatment Center.

Know the Responsibilities of Your Physician:

- n Obtain voluntary, written, informed consent from the patient or the patient's legal guardian
- n Enter an order for the named patient into the Marijuana Use Registry and update the registry within 7 days of any change

AQualified Patient Must:

- ⁿ Be diagnosed with a qualifying condition
- Has/obtains a Medical Marijuana Use Registry Identification Card.
- Be a Florida resident

Qualifying Conditions

Cancer Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) **F**pilepsy Annyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) Gaucoma Aterminal condition diagnosed by a physician other than the qualified HVADS physician is suing the physician Gohn's disease certification

Parkinson's disease Chronic nonmalignant pain caused by a qualifying medical condition or Miltiple sclerosis (MS) that originates from a qualifying Medical conditions of the same kind medical condition and persists beyond the usual course of that or class as or comparable to those qualifying medical condition above
